Realignment

Your future fulfillment is directly related to you finding and fulfilling your purpose.

Matthew 23:27 (NKJV) "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you are like whitewashed tombs which indeed appear beautiful outwardly, but inside are full of dead men's bones and all uncleanness."

When something is out of alignment internally, you eventually see and experience the results externally.
